



PATHS2 Focus on Future Health Promoters

through Ask Nigeria Internship

I uman resource development is a key feature for the implementation of the National Health Promotion Policy. Towards this aim, PATHS2 through the Ask Nigeria pilot process internship scheme commenced partnership with four academic institutions in order to provide this critical segment of human resource in Nigeria with firsthand and practical skills of health.

The four institutions include the Enugu State University of Technology (ESUT), Jigawa State Polytechnic, Bayero University (BUK), Kano and Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria, Kaduna State.

A dozen final year students were selected from health promotion related departments of the institutions like Mass Communications, Physical and Health Education and Community

Medicine. They must have offered course(s) such as development communication, maternal child health (MCH) education, communicable and noncommunicable diseases and adolescent health e.t.c.

The interns with the support of PATHS2 team and the NGOs/CSOs/CBOs participated in the entire Ask Nigeria process which include trainings, advocacies, community mobilisation, opinion polling, content research, public health dialogues, media production, monitoring and evaluation, report writing e.t.c.

They all had a Departmental Supervisor, who guided and monitored them throughout the Internship period.

Specifically, the internship programme modules will ensure that three students from each of the institutions gain firsthand experience in the following disciplines:

- Audience research (design, analysis, and utilisation of data in communication through the media polling).
- Community outreaches (mobilisation, facilitation and follow up of community dialogue through the qualitative discussions).
- Monitoring and Evaluation (media monitoring as part of the M&E framework).
- Media productions through the mass media outputs from Ask Nigeria.
- Documentation and Report writing through the knowledge management component.
